The Importance of Shade Trees

The members of the Woodbury Old-City Restoration Committee (“WORC”) and Woodbury City Council believe that our tree-lined streets and neighborhoods are one of the most attractive aspects of Woodbury. Our shade trees are an integral part of Woodbury’s small-town atmosphere. In addition to their aesthetic value, trees provide oxygen, help clean the air of pollutants, fight the greenhouse effect, and conserve energy by shading and cooling homes and buildings.

Unfortunately, over the past several years, many trees along our city streets have had to be removed because of disease, age, or sidewalk encroachment. Currently, there are dozens of locations throughout the City where trees have been removed and have NOT been replaced, due to constraints on the municipal budget. While the City recognizes the value of trees in our municipality, it is falling behind in its efforts to maintain our tree-lined streets.



Going Green

WORC, in conjunction with Woodbury City Council, are pleased to announce the 2008 Woodbury Shade Tree Replacement Program. Under this program, the City and WORC will undertake a homeowner purchase program where each resident will have the opportunity to have a shade tree planted by paying for the cost of the tree.

If you decide to participate, **the cost of the shade tree will be \$150.00.** The City, with a help of a generous donation from WORC, will absorb all remaining cost, including the cost of pick-up, delivery and installation of the shade tree. It is anticipated that the tree planting will occur in October or November 2008.



Decisions on Location

The location of the new tree will be determined by the homeowner and the City Environmental Officer. It is important to understand that the location of the tree will be influenced by the distance between

adjoining trees, the amount of area in the curb line and the existing position of underground and overhead utilities.



Type of Tree

The choice of trees in the program will include the following:

- Legacy Sugar Maple (Acer saccharum “Legacy”)
- Shademaster Honeylocust (Gledistia tricanthos)
- Skymaster English Oak (Quercus palustris)
- Northern Red Oak (Quercus ruba)
- Princeton Upright Scholartree (Sophora japonica “Princeton Upright”)
- Regent Scholartree (Sophora japonica)
- Village Green Japanese Zelkova (Zelkova serrata “Village Green”)
- Greenspire Littleleaf Linden (Tilia cordata)

The type of tree will also be governed by the surrounding area, water table and space available for planting.
